Angus VFD Report

Kim Newsom reported that the department had been busy this month. There was a work day a few weeks ago to mow and clean at the Mustang building. There will be another work day on Saturday, July 13th to do some work at the main station in preparation for the installation of the extractor and drying cabinet.

Jerry, Kim, and Dylan had attended the fire vendor show at Texas A&M the weekend of July 6th and looked at many items that could be used on the new fire engine that is being built. The new fire engine should be ready in approximately 1 year. They are preparing a list of things that are needed to equip the new truck and things that are wanted if money permits. They did some pricing of items at the show and spoke to some people about some equipment that could possibly be purchased at discounted prices.

Last month several members completed Wild Land training.

The Angus VFD has acquired a used drone that has an 8-mile radius and has 2 cameras (1 regular, 1 flare). Six members of the department have registered for a class that once completed, will allow them to test to be a licensed drone pilot.

Sewer Report

Kacy Perry reported that the meter has been calibrated at the sewer plant for this year and that he has made temporary repairs to the grating at the plant. He stated that there is a section of the grating that needs to be replaced and that he has spoken to a vendor who thinks they can get the needed materials.

Motion was made by Becky Henderson to table this item until the August 13th meeting so that the city could get more information on precisely what kind of building they are proposing and the exact location of the building. Motion was seconded by Eben Stover. Motion carried by unanimous vote.

Open floor to Visitors:

Kacy Perry asked the council if there was an ordinance that told what type of tap was needed for new sewer connections. He was told that there was not and that the city would leave that decision to the operator as to what kind of tap would be required.

Clayton Peters asked about what would be required if he decided to build a home on his lot on Birdwell Rd. He was told that mobile homes were not allowed and that he would need to submit a building plan prepared by a licensed architect for approval by the city's building inspector and pay all the permit and inspection fees.
