NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Angus, Texas that Chapter 34, Mobile Homes, Manufactured Homes and Parks, Article II, Mobile Homes Outside Mobile Home Parks, Section 34-77 are hereby repealed and the following sections pertaining to age restrictions on mobile homes shall be removed from the City of Angus, Texas Code of Ordinances:

Sec. 34-39. Age restriction on mobile homes.

Ordinance No. 117 which is older than ten years of age. All existing mobile homes located in the city as of the effective date of Ordinance No. 117 which is older than ten years of age.
