

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ANGUS, TEXAS AMENDING SEC. 2 – ENFORCEMENT, SUBSECTION a. OF ORDINANCE 172, AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ANGUS, TEXAS ADOPTING ANY CURRENT OR FUTURE BURN BANS ENFORCED BY NAVARRO COUNTY, TEXAS.

WHEREAS, Navarro County, by and through the Navarro County Judge and the Navarro County Commissioner's Court is authorized to declare a County wide ban on burning to protect the environment, promote public health and safety and to avoid nuisance conditions;

WHEREAS, the City Council for the City of Angus declares it is necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Angus, to adopt any current Navarro County burn bans and to adopt any future burn bans that Navarro County may enforce.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ANGUS, TEXAS:

**Section 1 - Adopted**

That the City Council for the City of Angus adopts any current Navarro County burn bans and adopts, any future burn bans enforced by Navarro County.

**Section 2 - Enforcement**

- a. The City of Angus/Richland Police Dept. or the Navarro County Sheriff's Office shall have the authority to enforce any and all provisions of this ordinance.
- b. Any person in violation of any provision of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine not exceed two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00).

**Section 3 – Adoption of Ordinance**

This ordinance shall become effective upon its approval and passage.
